# THE LIBRARY SPACE

#### **Reserve Materials**

Instructor-selected course materials and textbooks are placed "on reserve" for students enrolled in a particular class. These materials are kept at the circulation desk and are available for in-library use on a first come/first serve basis.

#### **Study Rooms**

Private rooms may be reserved for study groups and meetings of up to 12 people. Room features include flexible workspaces, ROKU televisions, and whiteboards.

#### Maker Space/Media Room

Items such as 3D printers, sewing machines, recording equipment, a green screen, an OWL camera, and a Cricut machine with accessories are available for in-library use. Use items on a first come/first serve basis or contact the library to reserve the room.

### **Computers and Printing**

24 computers are available for printing, scanning, and copying. Printing credits are allotted according to the number of credits enrolled. Students may add to funds via the Cashier's Office.
